Engaging Champions in Implementation Science for Cancer Prevention and Control

- Champions are critical to the effective integration of evidence-based interventions into community and healthcare settings
 - Individual within an organization who has a responsibility to advocate for change, motivate others and use their position and expert knowledge to facilitate the adoption of a particular innovation (Cranley 2017)
 - Individual(s) who dedicate themselves to supporting, marketing, and driving through an implementation, overcoming indifference or resistance that the intervention may provoke in an organization (Powell 2015)
- Our objective is to explore the process for identifying, engaging, supporting, and sustaining champions and their activities in intervention implementation across clinical and community settings

Engaging Champions in Implementation Science for Cancer Prevention and Control

- To date, we have conducted 25 in-depth, semi-structured interviews with project investigators (n=8), champions (n=10), and affiliates (n=7) across 8 community-based and clinic-based research studies.
 - An abstract with preliminary study results was accepted at the AcademyHealth dissemination & implementation conference
- The study will be submitted as a peer-reviewed open access manuscript by December 2023
- We expect that you can access the published manuscript by December 2024
