

NCI ESI MERIT Awards (R37) Overview

- NCI issued ESI MERIT Awards beginning FY18
 - Longer-term grant support for ESIs (up to 7 years)
 - Flexibility & opportunity for creativity and innovation
 - Additional time to **successfully launch careers** as early-stage faculty
 - Enhance number of publications and productivity before R01 renewal application and increased flexibility to stagger awards
- Percentiled ESI R01 applications that score within the standard payline are converted to R37 awards.
 - Eligible for 2-year extensions pending an expedited NCI review of accomplishments during the initial funding segment.



ESI MERIT Award Extension Request Process

- Extension request deadlines and requirements will be indicated in the R37 Notice of Award (NoA).
 - Please read the NoA!
 - Reminder emails from Office of Grants Administration (OGA) are sent to the PI and Authorized Organization Representative (AOR).
- Requests must be submitted electronically in response to a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)
 - https://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/pa-files/PAR-21-138.html
 - Any updated NOFOs will be linked from the original NOFO

ESI MERIT Award Extension Request Process

- All requests should be for a **2-year extension** of the award
- The total duration of the R37, both original and extension period, cannot exceed 7 years
- Questions can be directed to the Program Official (PO) or Grants Management Specialist (GMS)
 - Look in the eRA Commons for the most up to date assignments for both the PO and the GMS
 - Can't find an assignment? Send your question to <u>NCIGrantsPostAward@mail.nih.gov</u> – they will get you to a current OGA contact!

Request and Evaluation Deadlines Per NCAB Round

Submission Cycle (start dates)	Due Date of R37 Extension Request (of 2 nd to last R37 year)	Due Date of PO Evaluation to the DOC director (of 2 nd to last R37 year)	NCAB Date (of 2 nd to last R37 year)	
Cycle 1 (Dec – Mar)	July 1	August 1	September	
Cycle 2 (Apr – June)	November 1	December 1	February	
Cycle 3 (July – Sept 30)	March 1	April 1	June	

Example:

- A grant project period cycles April 1 (R37 ends March 31, 2028).
- The ESI MERIT Award extension request is due Nov 1, 2026.
- The request is reviewed by NCAB in Feb 2027.
- Check with your PO and/or GMS if you have questions about your receipt date.

ESI MERIT Award Extension Timeline

- Extension request is submitted November 1, 2026
- Extension request is approved February 2027
- RPPR for Year 5 submitted February 15, 2027
- NoA for Year 5 issued on/about April 1, 2027
- Progress Report for submitted February 1, 2028
- Extension (type 4) award is issued on/about April 2028

ESI MERIT Award Extension Request Components

Follow the Instructions in the SF424(R&R) Application Guide and the NOFO:

- 1. SF424(R&R) Cover
- 2. SF424(R&R) Project/Performance Site Locations
- 3. SF424(R&R) Other Project Information
 - Current IRB and/or IACUC approvals added as pdf attachments
- 4. SF424(R&R) Senior/Key Person Profile
- 5. R&R or Modular Budget
- 6. R&R Subaward Budget (if applicable)
- 7. PHS397 Cover Page Supplement
- 8. PHS 398 Research Plan
- 9. PHS Human Subjects and Clinical Trials Information

PHS398 Research Plan – Additional Information

The following sections indicated below must be included in the extension request Research Plan:

- Specific Aims page from the parent grant application (1 page maximum).
- Research Strategy (6 pages maximum) including a Progress Report, research plan for the extension period, and an explanation of how the plan falls <u>within scope</u> of the parent grant and represents a logical extension of the original aims.
- A separate list to describe progress in the following areas since the original date of the ESI MERIT Award:
 - All grant-related publications (published and submitted);
 - Presentations at National and International meetings;
 - Resource and data sharing, if applicable.
- Vertebrate Animals, only provide an updated section if proposing changes to the use of vertebrate animals. If there are no proposed changes, include a statement to indicate that there are no changes.

ESI MERIT Award Extension Budget – A Note

- Budget is limited to the committed Direct Cost of the 2nd to last year
 - 2nd to last year is the year the Extension Request is due
- If the Notice of Award has a Funding Policy Reduction, do not use the reduced Direct Costs as the limitation
 - Example:
 - Original committed amount \$228,750
 - 2nd to Last Year Award with NCI Funding Policy Reduction \$224,175
 - Extension request is limited to \$228,750 Direct Costs

ESI MERIT Award Extension Program Officer Review

- The PO will conduct a review of the extension request and develop a recommendation for National Cancer Advisory Board (NCAB).
- The review criteria include:
 - Evaluation of whether the extension request is within scope of the parent award and continues to be in an area of scientific importance or promise to the NCI.
 - Timeliness and significance of the research.
 - Productivity of the applicant and progress made during the current award period.

MERIT Award

The Method to Extend Research in Time (MERIT)(R37) Award provides longer term grant support to Early Stage Investigators (ESIs)* beginning with new, competing awards issued in FY 2018. Eligible investigators may obtain up to seven years of support in two segments: an initial five-year award and an opportunity for an extension of up to two additional years, based on an expedited NCI review of the accomplishments during the initial funding seament.

Investigators may not apply for an ESI MERIT award. ESIs who have submitted a single-Principal Investigator (PI) R01 application that received a score within the NCI payline are eligible for consideration. NCI program staff members will identify eligible candidate applications for the award and submit them to the National Cancer Advisory Board (NCAB) for consideration. If recommended by NCAB and approved by NCI leadership, the ESI R01 will be converted to an ESI MERIT Award (R37) for the initial five-year funding segment.

The ESI MERIT Award extension application will be submitted to the NCI 18 months prior to the end of the initial five-year project period. The extension application will be reviewed by NCI staff and submitted to NCAB for review and recommendation. If an extension is granted, the ESI MERIT Awardee will be notified of the length of time of the extension and the approved budget. If a proposed award does not receive an extension, the awardee may submit an application for review as a regular competing research grant application.

By providing ESIs with this prospect for longer term support, NCI intends to give awardees the opportunity for greater flexibility, creativity, and innovation in their research, as well as additional time to become more established before having to submit renewal applications.

* An Early Stage Investigator is a program director /principal investigator (PD/PI) who has completed his or her terminal research degree or end of post-graduate clinical training, whichever date is later, within the past 10 years and has not previously competed successfully as PD/PI for a substantial NIH independent research award
